## Food Service Sanitation Manager Certification (FSSMC) Classes

The FSSMC class uses the National Restaurant Association's ServSafe™ program, which incorporates lectures, videos, games, and hands-on activities to teach important food safety topics. Participants will learn to implement essential food safety practices and create a culture of food safety at their establishment. Total class time is approximately 8.5 hours, plus up to two hours for the exam. Students may either purchase their own ServSafe™ textbook from ServSafe.com (approximately \$50), or borrow a textbook from us.

**Cost:** \$60 class + \$38 exam = \$98

Class size is limited. Payment must be received at least 10 days prior to class.

**Location:** Room 307 at the Fulton County Health Department in Canton

Schedule: The class is held on two consecutive Wednesdays. The exam is given during the

afternoon on the second day of class. You must attend both days of class to take the exam and receive certification. Failure to attend any part of the class without prior approval forfeits class fee. A one-hour lunch break and several short breaks are built

into the class schedule each day.

**Exam:** On the day of the exam, you must provide photo ID and your Social Security Number.

A score of 75% or higher is required to pass the exam. If you do not pass the exam, you may retake it on one of our upcoming test dates. An exam fee of \$38 must be

paid for the retake.

**Certificate:** Students who pass the exam will receive a ServSafe™ certificate. They must then

apply to the IL Dept. of Public Health to obtain an Illinois FSSMC certificate. The fee charged by IDPH for the certificate is \$35. Illinois FSSMC certificates are valid for 5

years.
