For families with more than 18 persons, add \$643 for each additional person \$7,710

These figures are based on the 2023 Federal Poverty Guidelines published in the US Department of Health and Human Services in the Federal Register/Volume 88/Number 12/January 19, 2023. Given that the HHS allows 150% of FPG or 60% of SMI, where 200% of FPG is lower than 60% of SMI the program will be using 200% of FPG as our highest category. However, for the household size of 8 to 11 members, the benefit at 200% would exceed the allowable 60% SMI. For households larger than 11 members, the 150% will be set as the maximum income eligibility criteria. The state reserves the right to adjust these levels based on the availability of federal appropriations.
